


















Significant Incidents:

Round Lake Crews were dispatched to 16 structure fires in November. Of these, 4 were indistrict and 1 was significant:

November 2, 2023 at 03:24 hours:

Crews were dispatched for a report of a shed fire in the 1300 block of Williams Avenue in Round Lake Beach. Engine 263 arrived first and reported a fully involved shed with fire extension to the homes on the east and west sides. The E263 crew pulled a 2½" attack line and began a defensive attack to darken down the flames coming from the two residences. Engine 262 arrived next, established a water supply and then pulled a second 21/2" attack line to assist with fire control. Battalion 26 arrived and assumed command of the incident. A MABAS alarm was activated initially to the box level and then later upgraded to the 2nd alarm level, bringing in additional units from 15 different fire departments to assist at the scene and cover the remainder of the Fire District.

As more units and command staff arrived, the incident was separated into two distinct divisions, and the strategy was changed to an offensive attack. The fire was declared under control within an hour of the initial dispatch.

Two civilians were evaluated by EMS at the scene, and one was transported to Condell Medical Center with non-life-threatening injuries. There were no injuries to firefighters.

Both homes suffered extensive damage and were not habitable, and the shed was destroyed.







November 20, 2023 at 06:32 hours:

Crews were dispatched for a report of a motor vehicle accident with entrapment at the intersection of Fairfield Road and Nippersink Road. Battalion 26 arrived first and found a two-vehicle, head-on collision approximately 1/8 mile north of the intersection with heavy front-end damage to both vehicles. Engine 261 and Ambulance 261 arrived and began to assess and treat multiple patients. Three patients were able to be removed from the two vehicles with minimal extrication; however, the driver of one vehicle was severely entrapped in her vehicle due to the force of the accident collapsing the dashboard of the vehicle into her. Engine 261 began extrication efforts to remove her, while Ambulance 263's crew began treatment in the vehicle. Battalion 26 upgraded the alarm to bring in additional ambulances and a second engine. It took approximately 40 minutes for crews to extricate the patient. A total of four patients were treated and transported to Condell Medical Center.

Our crews were assisted at the scene by crews from Fox Lake and Grayslake. An ambulance from Mundelein was requested to Station 1 and covered the remainder of the Fire District during the incident.
